This may include fieldwork, interviews, laboratory experimentation, critical evaluation and interpretation, computer-based data analysis and evaluation or library research.</p> <p>Using initiative and creativity to identify areas for research develop new research methods and extend the research portfolio. Analysing and interpreting results of own research. Write up results and prepare papers for submission to appropriate journals and conferences, and other outputs as required and/or appropriate. Attend appropriate conferences for the purpose of disseminating research results of personal development. The post holder may also contribute to writing bids for research grants and will contribute to collaborative decision making with colleagues in areas of research.</p> <p>Continually to update knowledge and develop skills, and translate knowledge of advances in the area into research activity.</p> <p>To plan and manage own research activity in collaboration with others. To carry out administrative tasks associated with specified research funding, for example risk assessment of research activities, organisation of project meetings and documentation. Implementation of procedures required to ensure accurate and timely formal reporting and financial control.</p> <p>To contribute to teaching in the Faculty by carrying out student supervision and/or demonstrating within the post holder's area of expertise and under the direct guidance of a member of departmental academic staff, as appropriate.</p> <p>The post holder may occasionally be required to supervise more junior research staff.</p>

Job Summary and Purpose:

To undertake research and development work in accordance with the specified project(s) under the supervision of the principal investigator.

Main Responsibilities/Activities

To undertake a range of research activities within a specified research area, assuming responsibility for specific areas of projects and making use of new research techniques and methods, in consultation with the research award holder or supervisor.

This includes microbiology, molecular biology, genomics, bioinformatics, critical evaluation and interpretation, data analysis and evaluation of solutions to assess the different factors involved in the spread and persistence of antimicrobial resistance (AMR) in microbial pathogens within a One Health setting.

The responsibilities will include:

- Microbiology research with avian pathogenic *E. coli* and other microorganisms, including Class 2 pathogens.
- Genomics and bioinformatics analysis of microbial samples.
- Work with *in vitro* gut models to study the dynamics of AMR spread within the microflora.
- Use of metagenomics to analyse samples derived from gut model studies. Publication in highly ranked journals and attendance at conferences.
- Contributions to projects and effective collaboration with the co-researchers and the project partners.
- Documentation of project results and reporting back to the EU coordinator.

The post holder must have:

PhD/DPhil (or be near completion), in addition to holding a first degree in Life Sciences (Biology, Zoology, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine or equivalent).

Experience with microbiology and working with Class 2 microorganisms, molecular biology skills and affinity/experience with bioinformatic approaches for genomics.
